Consumer Directed Services is not an Agency and makes no representation (positive or negative) regarding the appropriateness of any PCA Candidate, or the terms and conditions of any employment relationship. All employment and payment decisions are the exclusive responsibility of the Consumer.

Note: If you are seeking employment from a Consumer who is receiving their service authorization from a New York State Medicaid funded Consumer Directed Personal Assistance Program, the Consumer is permitted to consider your employment only if you can pass ALL of the following New York State reviews.

1. You are an adult of at least 18 years of age.
2. The Consumer is not your spouse or (if the Consumer is younger than 21) is not your child.
3. You do not live in the home of the Consumer (unless their service requires it).
4. You are not the Designated Representative (Surrogate) of the Consumer.
5. You do not have any financial control over the Consumer.
6. Your information must pass a Federal and State Government Exclusion List Review.
- 7 You have a verifiable Social Security number and the qualified documents needed to prove that you are eligible to work in the United States.

The State of New York also requires each Personal Care Assistant to complete a Health Assessment BEFORE you begin work.

The Health Assessment includes:

- A basic physical exam - blood pressure, height, weight, etc.
- A TB (Tuberculosis) Screen (PPD) or a chest x-ray if the test is positive or if the test would not be appropriate
- A Measles and Rubella Screen or Vaccine
- A drug test of Urine (forensic toxicology)
- Documentation of vaccination against influenza, or wearing of a surgical or procedure mask during the influenza season

In addition to the above New York State requirements, the municipality in which the Consumer lives may also impose additional health assessments or legal reviews. The Consumer Directed Personal Assistance Program your Consumer chooses will require the completion of a Memorandum of Understanding (Consumer / Personal Care Assistant Agreement) to clarify the employment relationship, and they may require other documents to help them effectively complete their role as the Consumers Fiscal Intermediary.

New York State's leaders want to keep you in the dark about CDPA.

Governor Cuomo's Budget bans Fiscal Intermediaries from sharing basic information about services they offer. Further, a new proposal floating around Albany would limit the total number of FIs in the state to, at most, 8 - five in NYC, Long Island and Westchester and 3 throughout the entirety of the rest of the state.

This is a direct attack on CDPA and an attempt to prevent eligible New Yorkers from signing up for programs they qualify for, including CDPA. Eliminating CDPA would be extremely unpopular with voters. Instead, they want to curtail growth by eliminating consumer access and choice.

At its core, these proposals will take away your fiscal intermediary!

It does not take a rocket scientist to realize that these are both very dangerous proposals. Without the ability to advertise, thousands in need of CDPA will not find out about it. Limiting FIs will limit consumer choice to such a point that everyone will have an FI located in New York City or one or two cities Upstate.

Despite the fact that these proposals make no sense and are dangerous, we know one critical piece of information.

Weird things that make no sense happen in Albany in March.

Let's not kid ourselves, these actions, alone or together, will accomplish one thing - they will force more and more people with physical disabilities and seniors out of the community and into institutions.

You can make a difference. Contact the Governor, your Assemblymember, and your Senator today and tell them, "Don't destroy CDPA!"

OUR CAMPAIGN MESSAGE

Stop EVV understands that ending electronic visit verification in its entirety is not an option. They seek to end intrusive components. To that end, Stop EVV proposes the following:

1. Pass a congressional bill amending the 21st Century Cures Act to exempt consumer-directed programs, and family-provided care, from the EVV requirements, maintaining the intent and integrity of these programs and waivers;
2. Prohibit the use of invasive EVV components, including GPS tracking, camera use and audio recording within a consumer's private home; and
3. Recommend the use of web-based timesheets with dual authentication by both the consumer and the provider at the close of the pay period, like most government agencies use for their employees. A website timesheet can be designed to include entry for location, type of service provided, and start and end times. The consumer will be able to authenticate the hours and services provided using their own login and password. Each provider will also have their own, separate and unique login and password to authenticate timesheets. Once both parties have authenticated the same information, these web-based timesheets can be directly, electronically submitted to a third-party payroll for processing.

What is EVV?

Electronic Visit Verification (EVV) is an electronic method to verify that personal care providers clock-in to their work site when they deliver assistance and services to disabled and older Americans in a private home care setting.

In December 2016, Congress passed a federal law called the 21st Century Cures Act. The bill requires every state to implement a form of EVV for all personal care services and home health care services that are paid by Medicaid.

What are the problems with EVV in the community?

Some states are going far beyond the federal requirements by designing and/or purchasing EVV technologies that include GPS tracking, video cameras and audio recording that are out of the control of the consumer. We consider this to be a grave violation of privacy rights guaranteed to every American under the Fourth Amendment!

Furthermore, consumers report a larger than usual occurrence of providers quitting their long-term positions and leaving the home care industry in states where EVV implementation has begun. There already exists a severe nationwide shortage of home care providers. Coupled this decreasing pay that often falls at minimum wage, providers are choosing to find other careers where they have less responsibility, less scrutiny of their commitment and respect to their job, and better pay and benefits.

What is Stop EVV?

Stop EVV is a national grassroots campaign led by individuals with disabilities and personal care service providers. We aim to raise awareness surrounding the civil rights violations against disabled people through the use of certain Electronic Visit Verification (EVV) systems.
