Greetings – Here are some Medicaid updates from the Evelyn Frank Legal Resources Program, with links for where to find more information.

Good News for Medicaid in N.Y. State Budget

Good news for Medicaid recipients in the State Budget for 2014-15 just enacted on March 31, 2014. Read more about these three victories in the final budget – and others – here:

- o Keeps **Spousal Refusal** intact, along with “parental refusal” for children;
 - o Ensures “**Aid Continuing**” for **Managed Long Term Care (MLTC)** and other Medicaid managed care recipients when they appeal a reduction or even termination of their home care services by an MLTC or managed care plan,
 - o **Limits liens on the Estates of people who received “MAGI” Medicaid** – meaning they do not have Medicare and applied for Medicaid on NY State of Health Exchange
- Help for seniors other than in Medicaid -- Increases Income Limits for SCRIE Rent Increase Exemption and for EPIC Prescription Drug Subsidy**

Big thanks are due to NYS Assembly Health Committee Chair Richard Gottfried for his creative leadership and persistence on these issues!

Expansion of Mandatory Managed Care and MLTC to Include Nursing Home Residents

Still awaiting CMS approval, NYS has now delayed until June 1, 2014 the new requirement that mainstream Medicaid managed care plans as well as MLTC plans must now provide nursing home services, and that people who become permanent residents in nursing homes after June 1, 2014 will have to join a managed care or MLTC plan. This will start in NYC, Long Island and Westchester in June 2014 and then expand upstate in December 2014.

Fully Integrated Dual Advantage (FIDA) Demonstration program Delayed Until January 1, 2015

This demo has been delayed until January 2015 but voluntary enrollment will start earlier in October 2014. All MLTC and nursing home residents who have Medicaid and Medicare in NYC, Long Island and Westchester will receive notices telling them they may join a FIDA plan with the right to “opt out” if they don’t want to join. If they don’t opt out in 60 days, they will be automatically assigned to a plan. These plans will be like Medicaid Advantage Plus (MAP) plans – they will control and authorize all Medicare and Medicaid services. Read more about it here.

Two Developments in “Spousal Impoverishment” Protections

HRA Corrects Illegal Practice of Denying "Spousal Impoverishment" Income Allowance to Some Spouses of Nursing Home Residents - see [this article](#) - Thanks to advocacy by the NYS Bar Association Elder Law Section, over **600 spouses** of nursing home residents in NYC had their “spousal impoverishment” monthly income allowance reinstated. The NYC Medicaid program had improperly stopped budgeting these allowances if the community spouse had done a “spousal refusal.” Many individuals had won hearings against this practice, but when the Bar Association advocated, HRA changed its practice retroactively.

Any married MLTC recipient in NY State may now be budgeted to have the same spousal impoverishment protections that used to exist in the Lombardi program, and that are used in nursing home budgeting. See more in [this article](#).

Two of CDPAANYS priorities made it into the final budget.

AID CONTINUING RESTORED - Individuals who are in mainstream managed care and managed long term care will have the right to aid continuing, even if their authorization period runs out. This was an effort CDPAANYS has led the fight on for the past two years, along with the legal services groups and Medicaid Matters. We need to be thankful to the Assembly and Assembly Member Gottfried, who we understand refused to allow this to be taken off the negotiating table this year.

This was not an easy effort for anyone; but it will have a large impact on consumers facing the loss of hours or services in managed care and managed long term care. It is a critical step in making sure people have the ability to live in the community.

FISCAL INTERMEDIARIES INCLUDED IN THE VITAL ACCESS PROVIDERS PROGRAM (VAPP) - Early in the budget process, CDPAANYS was seeking a pass through of money to help offset costs associated with, among other things, the need to fund the changes to the Companionship Rule at the Federal level. When it became apparent this would not be effective, we shifted strategies, and the Assembly included language in their one-house bill that would allow Fiscal Intermediaries to be included in the Vital Access Provider Program, or VAPP.

In addition to allowing us to continue our advocacy to have the State provide assistance in the payment of costs associated with the Companionship rules, this accomplishes two other important goals. In the event of large influxes of individuals to CDPA, this will allow the Department to provide FIs with critical resources necessary to absorb them. Because of changes taking place, particularly downstate with wage parity in home care, this is a very real possibility.

Additionally, this provides continued recognition by the Governor and Legislature of the role that Fiscal Intermediaries play in the health and Long term services and supports community. It further legitimizes FIs and gives more credibility to the work that we do by making us eligible for the same dollars that all other providers qualify for.

COMMUNITY FIRST CHOICE - Unfortunately, only part of CFC happened as a part of this budget. Fortunately for us, it was the provisions making changes to CDPA that allow for the program to be used in the CFC program; however, it remains unclear as to whether this will be sufficient to allow for full implementation of CFC.

CDPAANYS would like to thank the range of organizations who worked with us in the budget process. New York Association on Independent Living and Center for Disability Rights were critical partners in this effort, helping to make sure that everyone knew the importance of the changes and helping to educate them as to the imperative nature of them and the civil rights implications. SEIU 1199 and PHI also both played a vital role, helping identify other coalition

partners and doing their own lobbying on behalf of the measure. We would like to acknowledge the New York State Nurses Association. As ADAPT occupied their offices, many organizations would have refused to enter into negotiations. NYSNA not only entered into meaningful talks; when the agreed to language was achieved, they immediately set their lobbyist to trying to achieve the change and included it in their lobby day efforts.

Finally, we would like to thank the Governor and his staff, the Senate and the Assembly. It is our understanding that through some communication glitches and the fact that staff had been negotiating for about 40 hours straight, the issue somehow got confused and they ran out of time. However, it does seem that, at the end, all parties were not only supportive but trying to get to resolution. This bodes well for efforts to either get the language done as a chapter amendment to the budget, or separately post-budget.

CONTRACTING FAIR HEARINGS - The Governor's original budget language allowed for fair hearings to be contracted to a private third party. It was determined the intent of this language was supposed to be much more limited, and the final budget is indicative of this. The final budget specifies that, for the purposes of the Fully Integrated Dual Advantage (FIDA) program, the Commissioner may contract with a private third party to assist in the resolution of fair hearings. This assistance does not include hearing cases.

HOME AND COMMUNITY BASED WORKGROUP - Last year's budget included language that created a workgroup for home and community-based services. This workgroup was primarily focused on regulations between the licensed home care service agencies and certified home health agencies. As a part of this year's budget, language was added that forces this workgroup to examine and create "best practices for clean claims and dispute resolution". In light of this new task, CDPAANYS will seek inclusion in the workgroup to ensure that FIs are adequately represented in this important topic.

MANAGED CARE CONSUMER ADVISORY REVIEW PANEL - The Managed Care Consumer Advisory Review Panel, or MCCARP, is an important tool that can be used to examine the impact managed care is having on the health care system. It was most active when managed care first was implemented; however, many advocates, led by Medicaid Matters, have been seeking reform for a few years now in light of the changes that have taken place with the Medicaid Redesign Team.

The budget expands the MCCARP by four seats, to include an individual with behavioral health needs and a dually eligible individual, as well as an individual from an organization representing people with behavioral health needs and an individual from an organization coordinating care for people with disabilities. The scope of the MCCARP was expanded to include evaluating the adequacy and appropriateness of program materials, evaluating trends in service denials, and assessing the impact on access to services for people with disabilities.

Overall, while the loss of CFC in the budget was critical, CDPAANYS is thrilled by the success we had in implementation. Thank you to everyone for your help in making this happen. CDPAANYS is only becoming what it is because of the commitment of our members.
