From the Bottom Up - Published: May 02, 2012

The poor, the old and the disabled who need help with everyday life tasks don't have to find themselves at the mercy of a system that allows them no say in how that care will be delivered, or who will provide it. Cash & Counseling turns that "system knows best" model of care on its head.

This is one in a series of stories about the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's landmark achievements, which continue to inspire us as we address future challenges.

As many as 15 million people need another person's help with the everyday tasks most of us take for granted, such as making meals, eating, bathing, dressing, and toileting.

For decades, the "system" has responded to this need by directing hundreds of thousands of Medicaid recipients out of their homes, away from their families, and into nursing homes.

In short: The system knows best.

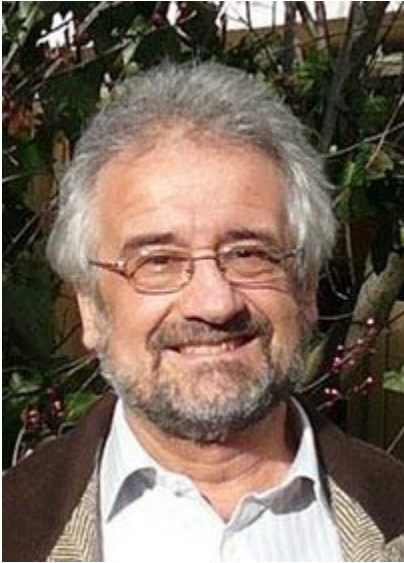
The relative few who did qualify for in-home care were allowed no say over who would help meet their daily needs, how and when those needs would be met, or even which were the most pressing needs.

We thought there was a better way. Our response: A modest program called Cash & Counseling, which is turning upside down the entrenched presumption that the poor, the old and the disabled are unable, unwilling, or too dishonest to responsibly manage the public funds spent on their in-home care.

We're accustomed to our role as a national philanthropy, taking on huge top-down issues like strengthening the public health system, improving care quality, and reversing the epidemic of childhood obesity. But sometimes, to make a real difference in the life of a single vulnerable human being, we work from the bottom up—one person, one outcome at a time.

Jack Resnick, MD, Family Practice Physician

Jack Resnick has been a solo general internist since 1997. He practices on Roosevelt Island in New York City and spends a third of his time on house calls to a population of frail elderly and disabled people. He graduated the NYU School of Medicine; trained in a primary care internal medicine residency and a psychosomatic medicine fellowship at the University of Rochester; and is a fellow of the American College of Physicians and the New York Academy of Medicine.

He is on the Independence at Home (IAH) Steering Committee of the of of the American Academy of House Call Physicians. The latter lobbied successfully to have IAH included in the Obama Health Care reform. The Act promotes house calls for the severely chronically ill as a way to improve the quality and control the cost of health care in the United States. He is one of 73 people in the nation appointed in January, 2012 to the position of Fellow in Medicare's Innovation Advisor Program

In his earlier career he was involved with prepaid group practice in the New York area. He started out as the first internist in an early staff model HMO, the Manhattan Health Plan. By the time that organization was acquired by HIP he had become its Medical Director. He then moved to the Long Island Jewish Medical Center where he took over the Community Health Plan, a multi-specialty group practice which was the original sole provider for the New York Blue Cross/Blue Shield HMO. He led that organization into becoming a globally-capitated provider of care to most of the HMOs in the metropolitan area. When those HMOs were reluctant to venture upon the newly available risk contracts for Medicare and Medicaid, Resnick obtained HMO licensure for the group and it entered directly into the commercial, Medicare and Medicaid managed care markets.

By the end of his tenure, CHP had expanded into three counties and covered 50,000 lives. Its captive HMO, Managed Health, inc. began to develop a network of hospital-based full-risk providers throughout the metropolitan area. That entity does business as First Health, New York's largest Medicaid HMO.

Resnick served nationally during the 1980' as the Chairman of the Medical Directors Division of the Group Health Association of America. The latter organization morphed into America's Health Insurance Plans.

He has been active on the national health care scene through the American Academy of House Call Physicians. AAHCP successfully lobbied for the inclusion of the Independence at Home Act in the Federal Health Care Reform bill of 2010. It promotes house calls for the severely chronically ill as a way to improve the quality and control the cost of health care in the United States. He is

In-Home Primary Care for Medicare Patients: Demonstration Begins Posted on May 3rd, 2012

Beginning June 1, 2012, 16 health care organizations, including visiting physician groups, will participate in the “Independence at Home” demonstration project, which will test whether delivering primary care services in a Medicare beneficiary’s home can improve the quality of care and reduce costs for patients living with chronic illnesses. The demonstration is authorized by the new Community First Choice rule, issued on April 26, 2012, by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) under the Affordable Care Act. The Community First Choice rule also creates a new state plan option in which states choosing to participate will receive a 6 percentage point increase in federal Medicaid matching funds for providing community-based attendant services and supports to beneficiaries who would otherwise be confined to a nursing home or other institution.

The Independence at Home demonstration is voluntary for Medicare beneficiaries, who will receive a complete range of in-home primary care services. The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services will partner with primary care practices led by physicians or nurse practitioners to evaluate whether delivering primary care services in a home setting is effective in improving care and reducing costs. Up to 10,000 Medicare beneficiaries will be able to obtain in-home care through the demonstration project, which is scheduled to go through May 31, 2015. The goal of the Community First Choice rule, according to HHS, is to provide “person-centered support” to Medicare and Medicaid beneficiaries that will keep them at home or in the community while receiving the care they need for chronic health conditions. Long-Term Care - Published: September 25, 2011

“[Bad Grades on Long-Term Care](#)” (New York Times editorial, Sept. 13) highlighted the problems in New York’s long-term care system. That the state ranks last in providing needed care to people with disabilities is unacceptable, and directly relates to other areas where it underperforms. One step the state should take to improve is to strengthen the consumer-directed program, a Medicaid home care program in which the consumer, not an agency, is responsible for hiring, training, supervising and, if necessary, dismissing, his personal assistant. In 1976, New York developed this model. Now, one in seven Californians with a disability use consumer-directed care. The next four states averaged one in 20. In New York, the number is one in 200. Research, including the [Commonwealth Fund/AARP](#) study you refer to, has shown that consumer direction provides better outcomes and a higher quality of life. As New York reshapes its Medicaid program, it must look to strengthen this model. Further, since many of the elderly can use the program, it cannot be limited to people with disabilities. This is better policy resulting in better lives.
