House calls: Relic of the past or the wave of the future?

Dr. Benneth Husted, founder and medical director of Housecall Providers, one of 17 U.S. health care organizations to participate in the national Medicare demonstration project, Independence at Home. The organization hosted a breakfast forum Wednesday on the future of house calls.

Back in 1930, half of all medical care was done in the home. Today house calls are relatively rare. But that may be changing. "You'll see more and more providers heading this way," predicted Dr. [Thomas Cornwell](#), president of the American Academy of Home Care Medicine and keynote speaker at a Wednesday breakfast forum hosted by Portland-based Housecall Providers.

The U.S. is the only developed country where house calls aren't the standard of care. But barriers are falling, including liability issues, technology and the perception that the service costs more. Providers can now perform EKGs, ultrasounds and other tests in the home. Demographic forces, those aging baby boomers, will drive the re-emergence of house calls.

"We have an exploding homebound population," Cornwell said. Studies have

shown the value of house calls in saving money and reducing hospital admissions and readmissions, he added. Housecall Providers is participating in Medicare's Independence at Home Demonstration, a three-year study that is expected to provide further evidence of the benefits of house calls.

“We believe Independence at Home has the potential to save Medicare,” said Dr. [Benneth Husted](#), who founded Housecall Providers as a nonprofit in 1995. “The medical community has been slow to accept the data out there.”

Many of these patients are invisible in society until they check into a hospital, which has created a blind spot surrounding the need for such care, she said. Ironically, payers are beginning to see the value of house calls, Husted said. Housecall Providers' second largest payer is CareOregon, which partners with four Coordinated Care Organizations. “Times are changing,” she said. “The conversation in 2014 is on managing the costliest patients and giving additional care at the right time and in the right setting.”

House calls address three fears that patients often have — the cost, the burden on family and friends and loss of independence, said Oregon Rep. [Barbara Smith Warner](#), a Portland Democrat who was also on the panel with CareOregon CEO [Patrick Curran](#). “How can we implement this model to become the default model of care?” she asked. Husted said the next step is for Congress to establish house calls as a standard benefit. “My dream is that one day all primary care providers will be doing homebound care,” Husted said.

As with everything else at Consumer Directed Services, the Consumer is exclusively responsible for initiating the conversation and it is up to the Consumer to determine if the information they are receiving is reasonable and appropriate to their situation.

Finally, I would like to express my thanks to Ms. Brand for asking the question and being the first to walk down an untried path. And now that we know that the results can be positive, I would like to invite you to try this new avenue as a means of building up your support network.

Now that the process of creating an organization has begun, a series of questions need to be addressed.

To begin, my first concern is the lack of Consumer participation in the Newsletter.

- Your input is needed to develop a system that will encourage Consumers to use the service. This request is based on my belief that Consumer traffic will promote PCA participation, which will in-tern improve the service for all.
- Also, if more general information is wanted, Consumer sourced articles, comments, and observations – related to the Consumer Directed Personal Assistance Program (CDPAP) are welcome (please no personal attacks, language that would be unsuitable for a general audience, or agency advertisements.).

Next are the issues of organizational structure. Although is has been my consistent belief that Consumer participation on the Board of Directors is essential for an

organization that claims any connection to the CDPAP. The question is how can the organization nurture a cadre of Consumers who are capable of making a positive contribution to the organization's mission?

To identify this group of Consumers I propose the following multi-step approach to Consumer Board Membership.

First, to help support the organization I propose an annual Consumer Membership fee. Although other individuals and organizations (especially Fiscal Intermediaries) would be encouraged to contribute to the organization, only Consumers would be counted as Members.

Second, although all Consumers would be able to utilize the service, only dues paying Members would be given the opportunity to participate in the Consumer Advisory Council. Consumer candidates would be elected to the Council by the Members. Council participation would be limited to two, two-year terms.

Third, when a Consumer seat on the Board becomes available, the new Board Member would be selected from the active members of the Council by the remaining members of the Board of Directors and their term would again be limited to two -two year terms.

Finally, if you wish to continue to receive the newsletter, please send a reply email. If you, as a Consumer or Advocate have not yet responded to the following information which was originally published on May 18th I look forward to your comments and recommendations.
